ACTIVE MOBILITY ACT 2017

ACTIVE MOBILITY (DEALING IN PERSONAL MOBILITY DEVICES AND MOBILITY VEHICLES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2026

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 67 of the Active Mobility Act 2017, the Land Transport Authority of Singapore, with the approval of the Acting Minister for Transport, makes the following Regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations are the Active Mobility (Dealing in Personal Mobility Devices and Mobility Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 2026 and come into operation on 8 April 2026.

Amendment of regulation 2

2. In the Active Mobility (Dealing in Personal Mobility Devices and Mobility Vehicles) Regulations 2018 (G.N. No. S 243/2018) (called in these Regulations the principal Regulations), in regulation 2, delete the definition of “mobility vehicle”.

Amendment of regulation 4

3. In the principal Regulations, in regulation 4, delete paragraph (2).

Amendment of Second Schedule

4. In the principal Regulations, in the Second Schedule, replace the warning notice with —

Regulations for Personal Mobility Aids (PMAs)

PMAs are **single-seater** devices, designed to carry an individual who has difficulty in walking.

Your device must only have a single seat.

FROM 1 JUN 2026

Dimension¹ and Speed² Limits

For all PMAs (wheelchairs and mobility scooters) used on paths



- Max height **150cm**
- Max width **70cm**
- Max length **120cm**



Max laden weight
300kg



Max speed²
6km/h

Penalty for riding PMA at >6km/h on public paths
FINE up to \$2,000, or JAIL up to 3 months, or BOTH

Penalty for riding non-compliant PMA² on public paths
FINE up to \$10,000, or JAIL up to 6 months, or BOTH

Mobility scooter users need Certificate of Medical Need or exemption

Visit your regular doctor, regular occupational therapist or a General Practitioner to undergo the Assessment for Mobility Scooter.

Penalty for riding a mobility scooter on public paths without certification
FINE up to \$2,000, or JAIL up to 6 months, or BOTH

Only registered mobility scooters can be displayed, advertised and sold

Ensure the retailer has registered the mobility scooter with LTA before you purchase.

Penalty for selling unregistered/ non-compliant mobility scooter
FINE up to \$20,000, or JAIL up to 24 months, or BOTH

¹ Users who have been certified to have a medical need for a device above the allowable dimensions are allowed to use the devices on public paths.
² From 1 June 2026, retailers are prohibited to sell, display or advertise PMAs with a device speed exceeding 6km/h.
³ Non-compliant PMAs refer to PMAs that exceed the allowable dimensions and/or have maximum device speeds exceeding 6km/h. Users of PMAs with device speeds up to 10km/h can continue to use their devices until 31 Dec 2028, but must travel no faster than 6km/h on public paths.

FROM 1 JAN 2029

Using an unregistered mobility scooter on paths is an offence.

- Registration of existing mobility scooters (i.e., purchased before 1 June 2026) will commence in mid-2027.

Penalty for using unregistered mobility scooter on public paths
FINE up to \$2,000, or JAIL up to 3 months, or BOTH

Maximum device speed of all PMAs on public paths capped at 6km/h.

- Offenders will face penalties for riding a non-compliant PMA on public paths.

Repeat offenders may face higher court fines and/or jail terms
